


V_{CE}, COLLECTOR-EMITTER VOLTAGE (V)


Figure 5. V_{CE(sat)} vs. T_J

Figure 8. Typical Gate Charge







Figure 9. Switching Loss vs. Temperature

Figure 10. Switching Time vs. Temperature






Figure 11. Switching Loss vs. I_C




Figure 13. Switching Loss vs. Ra




Figure 14. Switching Time vs. Rq




Figure 15. Switching Loss vs. V_{CE}




Figure 16. Switching Time vs. V_{CE}




Figure 17. Safe Operating Area





Figure 18. Reverse Bias Safe Operating Area






Figure 23. IGBT Transient Thermal Impedance





Figure 24. Diode Transient Thermal Impedance


