


#### **General Description**

The FDMS7570S has been designed to minimize losses in power conversion application. 




Figure 1. On Region Characteristics




Figure 3. Normalized On Resistance vs Junction Temperature




Figure 5. Transfer Characteristics




Figure 2. Normalized On-Resistance vs Drain Current and Gate Voltage




Figure 4. On-Resistance vs Gate to Source Voltage




Figure 6. Source to Drain Diode Forward Voltage vs Source Current




Figure 7. Gate Charge Characteristics




Figure 9. Unclamped Inductive Switching Capability




Figure 11. Forward Bias Safe Operating Area




Figure 8. Capacitance vs Drain to Source Voltage




Figure 10. Maximum Continuous Drain Current vs Case Temperature




Figure 12. Single Pulse Maximum Power Dissipation




Figure 13. Junction-to-Ambient Transient Thermal Response Curve

## SyncFET Schottky body diode Characteristics




Figure 14. FDMS7570S SyncFET body diode reverse recovery characteristic

Fairchild's SyncFET process embeds a Schottky diode in parallel with PowerTrench MoSFET. This diode exhibits similar characteristics to a discrete external Schottky diode in parallel with a MOSFET. Figure 14 shows the reverses recovery characteristic of the FDMS7570S.

Schottky barrier diodes exhibit significant leakage at high temperature and high reverse voltage. This will increase the power in the device.





Figure 15. SyncFET body diode reverses leakage versus drain-source voltage



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
