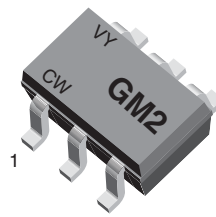


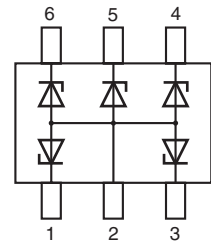

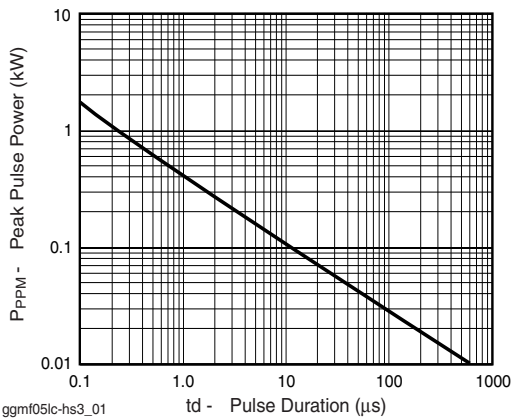


Figure 1. Non -Repetitive Peak Pulse Power vs. Pulse Time

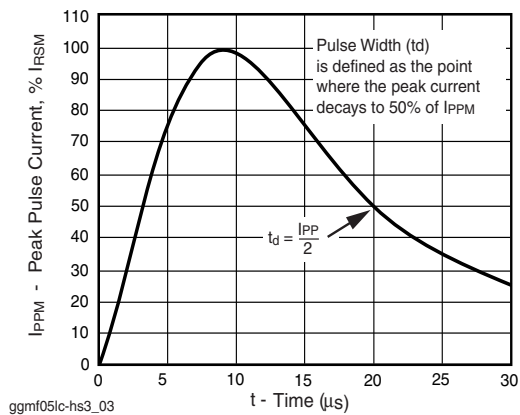


Figure 3. Pulse Waveform

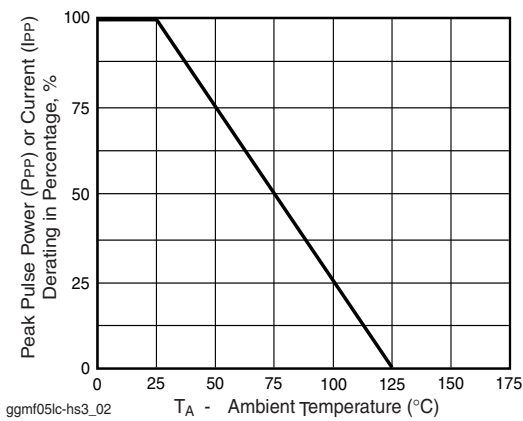


Figure 2. Pulse Derating Curve

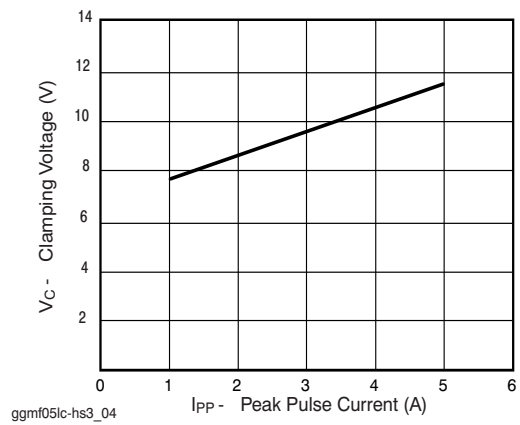
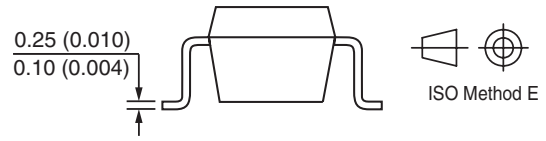
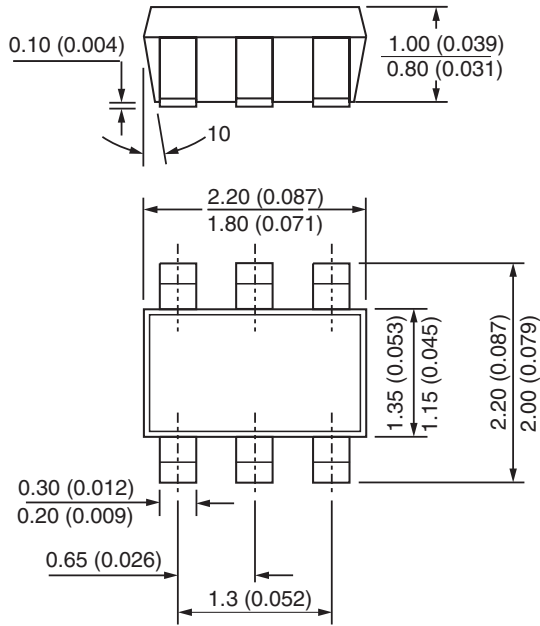
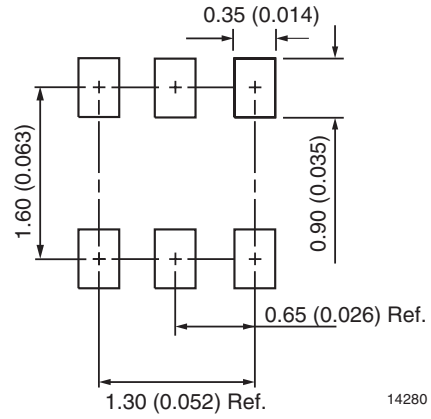


Figure 4. Clamping Voltage vs. Peak Pulse Current

### Ozone Depleting Substances Policy Statement

3. Council Decision 88/540/EEC and 91/690/EEC Annex A, B and C (transitional substances) respectively.
