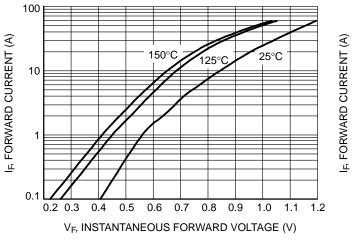

Figure 2. Maximum Forward Voltage

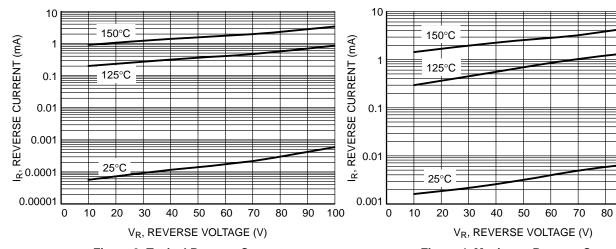
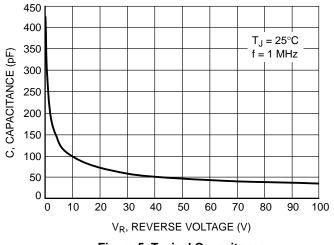


Figure 3. Typical Reverse Current

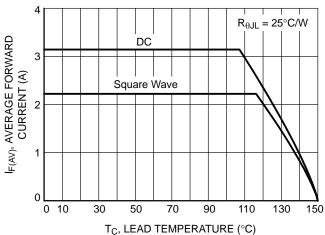


Figure 5. Typical Capacitance

Figure 6. Current Derating

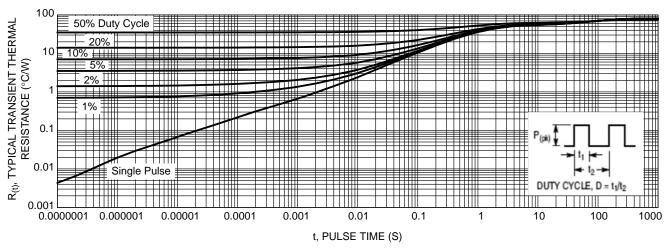
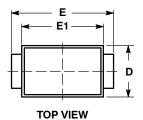


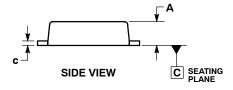
Figure 7. Typical Transient Thermal Response, Junction-to-Ambient

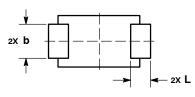


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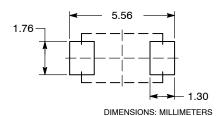
